CAP Workshops

CAP takes a fresh approach to assault prevention, aiming to reduce fear by focusing on what children can do, rather than on what they can't.

The workshops are designed to build children's confidence and self-esteem, and are lively and fun. Children learn through drama and discussion with trained facilitators, about their rights to safety, strength and freedom. They are encouraged to be proud of these rights and to respect the rights of others.

Through the workshops the children learn that they have the ability to protect themselves in unsafe situations.

Years 4-6 will have a whole 3 hour workshop
Year 3 will have one session per day split over these three days.

Next week, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will have the workshop split over three days.

Parenting Children in a Digital World

This is a document on our website. We have some copies in the office or could Email it to you. Please read it as it will help keep children safe.

Accelerated Reader

Please encourage your child if they are Year 2 or up to read as many books as possible and to complete quizzes. We have proof that those children who quiz regularly make better progress and from the data we get we can analyse the skills they need to develop further. Groups work in school and also class reading inputs are then planned to support the learning. Our good results show the impact of the high quality targeted teaching and also the impact of AR.

Purple Mash

We are using Purple Mash as our ICT scheme and we are allocating activities to the children. There are modules related to internet safety as well. All the programs to support learning are there for children to access. Having spent time over half term looking, it is amazing how the site can support learning in many areas of the curriculum.

You will be able to access information about the computing scheme on our website in the next few weeks, as it is further developed.

Google Classroom and Chrome Books

We are now using Google Classroom and the children now have their own logins. As always with new systems we have had a few incidents, but our ICT support technicians have quickly sorted things for us. We have 120 new chrome books available and will be moving to a total cloud based storage system.

Glasses

If your child should wear glasses do make sure that you let the school know so that it can be monitored. Also, have your child's eyes tested regularly, it is a free test for children and it is vital to pick up any issues as soon as possible.

Manners, courtesy and our school values

We expect our children to demonstrate good manners and expect them to say thank you, open doors, support one another and to treat others with respect. We have so many amazing role models that demonstrate these skills every day. We are recognising this with our badges. Over the next few weeks staff will nominate children to receive them. If you feel that there are children who you have seen consistently demonstrating our values or standing out for the right reasons, please let us know.

Headphones

Some children really benefit from having headphones in the classroom to aid concentration. This can be part of their individualised support programme, however we do not want children to feel different in any way. To prevent this and also to enable pupils to make the decision for themselves about whether this helps their learning, classrooms have headphones available for all children to use. They have become a very popular resource in many rooms. They obviously do not use them during class inputs.
