Double delight for SRG's Sportshall Athletics Superstars!

On Tuesday last week we took two teams of eager athletes to Launceston College to compete in the first round of the Arena Sportshall Athletics Festivals. We were competing against teams from 7 other schools. We started brilliantly, winning both boys and girls obstacle relays and this set the tone for the rest of the competition with dominant displays from every member of the team on the track and on the 6 different field events. When all the points had been totalled up the SRG team waited, feeling a mix of nervous excitement and enthusiasm as the organiser counted down the schools from 8th place to 3rd... When our name hadn't been called out, we knew we'd come in the top 2! After what seemed like an age... he announced that Bishop Cornish had come second, meaning that we had won! We jumped around, high fived anyone who would give us a high five and got back on the minibus to come back to school.
