


legacy	Something that is passed on or conveyed	Important facts to know by the end of the Victorian topic: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know that there was a distinct contrast between the lives of the rich and the poor. • Know that the increase in inventions paved the way for Britain to solidify itself across the globe and increase trade and exportation. • Know that the Victorian era was responsible for the development of the railway network to which we still use today. • Know that life for people living in the Victorian era was not easy, where families (children) had to work from a young age in order to live and often resorted to workhouses in order to survive. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The average life expectancy during the Victorian era was 42 for women and just 40 for men • The Victorian era was responsible for inventing the lightbulb, telephone and railway systems • Due to the Suffrage campaign, women's rights dramatically increased including their right to vote • Workhouses had children as young as three working long hours in exchange for accommodation.
