Rewards

We celebrate effort and achievement in many ways. Children receive stickers, house points, do-jo points and gold cards in class and around the school.

We present weekly trophies that are given in Friday assemblies - all staff nominate children, and we keep records so we can make sure a variety of children are recognised over the year.

Children earn sparkly pencils, first handwriting pens, second pens, fountain pens and the ultimate pen when their writing meets different criteria.

Mathletics and Education City certificates can be earned by every child every week and presented in assembly. We present badges for Mathletics and Accelerated Reader and for many other qualities and demonstration of values. There are also badges for achievement and progress in other areas including tables.

Finally, children are all recognised at Speech Day.

All children are different and often bring in awards that they earn in swimming, sailing, football, rugby, kick boxing, taekwondo etc. If your child has a certificate from outside school, encourage them to bring it in to share.

Some children will also have additional schemes for a period of time to support their learning or improvement in attitude or behaviour if this approach is necessary. We find that positive approaches encourage higher self-esteem and better progress. Please celebrate with your child and encourage them to work towards one of the awards.

School Development Plan

Our new plan runs from 1st September 2021 to 31st August 2022 in line with the academic and financial year. We have updated and written our new plan focussing on learning for this year. Copies will be displayed in the meeting room and in the parent's section on the website after it has been approved by the governors.

Eye Test

Please make sure that your child has their eyesight tested regularly as it is amazing how many children have not visited the optician. Each year we notice that some children cannot see the board, so please book appointments as they are free for children.

Please note that if you have any concerns about learning... at Noakes Habermehl they can do an extra test for Colorimetry which helps look at whether your child has issues that makes reading more difficult. It is a test that you will have to pay for but is worth considering if copying words and reading is more difficult.

Hearing

Please speak to the doctors and ask for a hearing test if you feel your child's hearing may be causing problems. Children will have intermittent losses and at any time in a classroom 3 out of 10 could have issues with colds. It is amazing how much can be lost if the hearing loss is persistent.

Saltash Leisure Centre
