



Important Facts	<p>Pointillist paintings are created by using small dots in different colours to build up the whole picture. Colours are placed near each other rather than mixed.</p> 	
Ecollage	A template within 2paint where an image is made by creating stamps that can then be placed on a picture.	Piet Mondria is a Dutch artist best known for his abstract paintings	<p>Impressionism became most popular in the 1870s and 1880s. It differed from the common art of the time because it wasn't religious art but was just intended to capture a scene at a moment. The art gave an 'impression' of the scene.</p>
