If you need to add the minutes that will go last.  7:20 = is <b>sept heures vingt</b> 11:55 = is <b>douze heures moins cinq</b>	Quel dommage! - What a pity!
dix heures moins dix	ten minutes to ten		Oh mince! - Oh darn!
Il est midi	it is noon (12 o'clock)		Ah non! - Oh no!
Il est minuit	It is midnight	The word <b>moins</b> in French means minus. So twenty to nine (8:40) is written as: <b>neuf heures moins vingt</b>  Telling the time involving am and pm is written like this...  5am is <b>cinq heures du matin</b> 3pm is <b>trois heures de l'après-midi</b>	Oh zut! - Oh damn!
