		<p>Judaism is the religion of the Jewish people. It is the oldest of the world's four biggest monotheistic religions (a religion based on the belief that there is only one God), dating back over 4000 years.</p>	<p>During Shabbat, Jewish people remember the story of creation from the Torah where God created the world in 6 days and rested on the 7th day.</p>
		<p>Jewish people learn lots from the stories in their sacred texts. Some of the stories are the same as stories in the Christian Bible and the Muslim Qur'an.</p>	<p>Chanukah is observed for eight nights and days every year. Normally it occurs between late November and December, although the exact dates change every year. This is because Hanukkah is always on the 25th day of Kislev in the Hebrew calendar.</p>
