**School Lunches**

We have a number of children who are arriving late (or hovering around lockers) and not putting their school lunch orders in. This has a knock-on effect in the kitchen at lunchtime – the kitchen staff do cook extra food but sometimes we have quite a high number of 'extras'.

If your child is arriving late due to a scheduled appointment, please order their lunch when you call in to let us know where they are for registration (and safeguarding) purposes.

**Commemoration of D-Day Landings**

In Tuesday's whole school worship, we watched a short video prepared by the BBC for Primary aged children to mark and commemorate the important 80-year anniversary of the D-Day landings.

Children learned about why this was such an important point in history and heard from a man who remembered hearing about it when he was 7 years old on the 'wireless'. We also flew the Royal Ensign flag on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June, the day itself.

## Sports Update

### SRG hockey teams go all the way to the finals!

On Thursday this week we took two teams to the Marjon's Hockey Festival and came back festooned with medals!

The B team were placed into a really tough group and managed to win two of their five games, finishing 4th. Good 2-0 wins against teams from Horrabridge school and Cathedral School were secured in our 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> group games, but defeats in our 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> group games meant we qualified for the Shield competition. Our knock out games began with a comfortable 5-0 win against another team from Horrabridge school meant we'd qualified for semi-final. We then went on to win that match 3-0 and had qualified for the Shield final.

Keyham Barton were our opponents in the final. Whilst we had the lion share of possession and created lots of good chances to score the final ended 0:0 at the end of normal time. We were then faced with the dreaded penalty shoot-out which we unfortunately lost 2:1. Despite losing, we'd surpassed all our expectations and were so chuffed to have reached the final.

SRG A team put on a fine performance in the Group stages to finish 2<sup>nd</sup> - winning 3, drawing 1 and losing 1; amassing an impressive 19 goals with triple hat-trick hero Ashton grabbing 10, Olivia netting 3, Henry and Tom with 2 a-piece and Alice and Ellis each scoring once too, showing the rest of the teams that little SRG from Cornwall had arrived and meant business!

We moved onto the Cup knockout stages confident in our ability to work together as a team and made no mistake with a 4-0 win against St Andrews Buckland. Another two goals for Ashton, a belter from Henry and super-sub Tom grabbing the winning goal with his first touch of the ball after coming on!

SRG A were on fire, with Emily, Ellis and Gracie solid and reliable in defence and Olivia running rings round the midfield. We knew the games were just going to get harder as we progressed so we remained calm and focussed going into the Quarter Final against Horrabridge B. Some determined runs from Alice up the left wing and Ashton showing everyone his silky stick work meant we cruised to a 3-0 victory.

We were game-on for the Semi Final... and then we discovered we were to face Kings, who were the only team to have beaten us so far today! A quick coach's tactics briefing between Claire and Mr Yeoman and we were ready. Henry was dispatched to man-mark their star player out of the game and the rest of the squad were given a clear message - keep doing what you've been doing all day; working hard as a team! The first few minutes were tense, with both teams struggling to find a way though, but it was a defence splitting pass from Emily to Olivia that broke the deadlock. Once the Kings heads were down SRG couldn't stop, with Henry netting two before Ashton sealed the deal. With a shot from Gracie narrowly shaving the outside of the post, the game ended 4-0 to SRG and Kings were left wondering what on earth had hit them!

In the Cup Final, we faced last year's winners Horrabridge A, so we knew we were in for a tough match. Despite some dogged defending and heroic breakthrough runs, Horrabridge proved too experienced for us and they beat us 4-1. However, we couldn't be prouder of the team's performance throughout the day and are delighted to have made it all the way to the Final.

So unbelievably, both teams had made their respective finals. At the presentations our A team were pleased to be awarded bronze medals for the skills challenges as well as both teams receiving their silver runners up medals. To top it all off Olivia from Year 6 was awarded a fantastic new hockey stick as she was chosen as the girl of the tournament!

What pleased Mrs Brown, Mr Yeoman and myself were the comments we received from the organisers who commended our children for their great manners throughout the day. They were an absolute pleasure to take out today and we as staff couldn't have asked for anything more from any of the children. Well done SRG!
